Jeewan Utthan is an organisation in Nepal that was set up in 2002 by a social worker and her husband to run an orphanage to rescue children from the mountains who have lost their parents through HIV and ill health, or whose parents abandon them because they can't look after them.

They currently have seventeen children living with them ranging in age from 18 months to 9 years old. Bina and Hom provide the children with food, clothing and shelter as well as ensuring that they attend the local school.

They share a building which consists of 3 rooms, a kitchen and one bathroom and have no safe outside area for the

children to play in as it backs on to a busy road. They recently had to give up 2 of the rooms they rent because they can no longer afford them; as a result the children have hardly anywhere to play together.

Money is extremely tight as the orphanage has no regular income apart from Hom the husband's wages as a waiter and a \$100 donation from an American man each month. The income the orphanage currently receives is only enough to feed the children with rice on a monthly basis. They cannot afford to feed the children any vegetables or meat, and they are very behind in their rental payments.





It is also impossible for them to buy the children much needed new clothes from the local market, and ensure that they have basic medical supplies.

Aspect Finance has pledged to help this orphanage and contribute a regular income to help them survive and provide the children with the best quality of life possible. These children have lost everything so if we can ensure that they at least receive a good diet, good education and healthcare then we will go some way to giving them the start in life that they deserve.
